Reference Committee

The Reference Committee will meet on Saturday, August 27 at 10:00 a.m. in room Bluegrass CDE to hear testimony on resolutions. REFERENCE COMMITTEE HEARING

Saturday, August 27

The Reference Committee hearing will take place in room Bluegrass CDE from 10:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m.

Every effort will be made to permit full consideration of each matter of business, but the cooperation of each member is requested so the business may be expedited. After everyone has been heard, the Reference Committee will go into a closed session and develop recommendations on each matter assigned to it. The House of Delegates may amend the Reference Committee's report, as desired, but when finally adopted, the report of the Reference Committee, as submitted or as amended, represents the official policy of the Kentucky Medical Association.

HOUSE OF DELEGATES MEETING

Sunday, August 28

The House of Delegates will begin at 12:30 p.m. in Commonwealth CD, and a box lunch will be provided. Voting during the meeting will take place through an electronic voting system hosted by Data on the Spot. Each credentialed delegate will receive a hand-held electronic voting device either in their caucus meeting or at the registration desk prior to the start of the House of Delegates meeting. A brief voting system test will be conducted at the beginning of the meeting to ensure all devices are operational. Please plan to arrive early in order to receive your device and participate in the voting system test.

OPERATIONAL PROCEDURES

New Business

Chapter III, Section 9 of the Bylaws states:

"No Resolution shall be introduced at the regular session of the House of Delegates by any member or group of members other than the Board of Trustees unless a copy thereof was furnished to the Headquarters Office at least thirty days prior to its introduction. Resolutions furnished after the deadline will be considered as new business at the regular session of the House of Delegates and must include a showing that the issue addressed by the Resolution either did not exist or was unknowable until after the deadline. New business shall be introduced in the House only by unanimous consent, except when presented by the Board of Trustees. All new business so presented shall require the affirmative vote of three-fourths of those Delegates present and voting, for adoption."

If You Want the Floor

If you wish to speak during any meeting of the House, or if you wish to make a motion, go to the nearest floor microphone, and when called upon, identify yourself by giving your name along with the name of the county medical society you represent, if applicable, and whether you are speaking in support or in opposition to the motion. If you wish to make a motion that is longer than 25 words, you must present it in writing to the Speaker as soon as you make it. This will ensure accuracy and expedite the meeting.

Consent Calendar

During the House meeting, the Reference Committee report will be presented, debated, and voted upon. The Chair of the committee will first present the Consent Calendar to be voted on as a whole. Any Delegate may ask that an item be extracted from the Consent Calendar for further discussion. The remaining items on the Consent Calendar will then be addressed as a whole. Any extracted items will be presented individually with the recommendation of the Reference Committee, and the House will vote on each motion. Discussion from the floor will be limited to **five minutes** for each subject unless additional time is granted by unanimous consent of the House. The deliberations of the Association are governed by parliamentary usage as contained in the latest edition of *The Standard Code of Parliamentary Procedure* by Alice Sturgis.
