

GREETINGS! KEVIN O'BRYAN, MD

Dear Colleagues,

2025 KDA MEETING IN REVIEW




Colleagues from across the state recently came together for the 2024 KDA Annual Meeting in Louisville.

Keynote speaker, Robert Brodell, MD, from the University of Mississippi joined us to discuss strategies to combat the physician shortage crisis.

Clinical presentations included updates about new biologic and immunosupressant therapies in dermatology, rare cutaneous events associated with immune checkpoint inhibitor therapy, and overlap in morphologies of cutaneous diseases.

KMA Executive Vice President and Director of Advocacy, Cory Meadows provided an update on the 2024 legislative session, including efforts to combat prior authorization and scope creep and discussed how dermatologists can make an impact through advocacy.


